- A prayer in Masjid Al-Haram is worth 1,000,000 times more reward than anywhere else

- 99 Domes Mosque also known as 99 Kuba is located in the Tanjung Bunga Makassar area of Indonesia

- It is the largest mosque in the Sulawesi province and ranked one of the 10 most unique mosques in Indonesia

- Jami-Ul-Alfar, more commonly referred to as 'The Red Mosque' is located in the city of Colombo in Sri Lanka
- The Jami-Ul-Alfar was constructed in 1908 and is one of Colombos oldest mosques
- The local Indian Muslim community, centered in the neighbourhood of Pettah, commissioned the mosque to accommodate their prayer needs
- The mosque is designed in a blend of architectural styles, including Neo-Moorish, Indo-Islamic, and Indian Muslim

- Bibi Khanym Mosque is located in Samarkand in Uzbekistan
- It was one of the most ambitious architectural projects of the Timurid period and influenced the architecture of Central Asia as well as of Iran and Afghanistan
- The Timurid was a Turco-Mongol empire that dominated Greater Iran in the early 15th century
- The Bibi Khanym Mosque, in central Samarkand, is the largest of its kind and capable of hosting nearly 10,000 worshippers

- The Sheikh Zayed Mosque is located in Abu Dhabi in the capital of the United Arab Emirate (U.A.E)

- The mosque is large enough to accommodate over 40,100 worshippers
- It's made up of mostly natural materials such as marble, stone, gold, crystals and semi-precious stones

## Yellow Mosque

- The Yellow Mosque is located in Murshidabad, West Bengal in India
- It is also known as Zurud Mosque
- It is one of the few surviving examples of the Mughal architectural style in Bengal and is considered an important cultural heritage site
- Built in the late 18th century by Haji Ahmed, who was the chief treasurer of the Nawab of Bengal, Siraj-ud-Daula
